À l'occasion de la fête du Canada, au début du mois, *Maclean's* s'est donné pour mission de présenter le Canada et les Canadiens sous un éclairage différent (Voyez l'article complet en anglais à la suite du texte en français reproduit ici. Il en a résulté 22 cartes, insolites et informatives, traitant de sujets aussi vastes que l'obésité, le hockey, la religion, le cinéma ou l'économie. En voici quelques-unes.

#### MOSCOU, ALBERTA

Ontario et Californie, même combat ? Nombreux sont ceux qui l'ignorent, mais la pointe sud-ouest de l'Ontario se trouve être sur la même latitude que certaines régions de la Californie. Ainsi, l'île Pelée, sur la rive nord du lac Érié, se situe à la même hauteur que la ville californienne de Crescent City. Au petit jeu des latitudes, Vancouver se compare à Paris (France), Calgary à Londres (Angleterre), Yellowknife à Oslo (Norvège), Saskatoon à Berlin (Allemagne), Winnipeg à Kiev (Ukraine), Montréal à Portland (Oregon, États-Unis) et Québec à Oulan-Bator (Mongolie).




#### ALZHEIMER: UNE AMPLEUR INQUIÉTANTE

Maclean's s'est penché sur les 10 principales causes de décès dans les provinces et les territoires. De manière générale, ce sont le cancer et les maladies cardiaques qui sont les plus meurtriers au Canada. Mais chaque région est affectée de manière disproportionnée, en comparaison à la moyenne nationale, par une cause de décès en particulier. Au Québec, il s'agit de la maladie d'Alzheimer. L'Ontario est davantage touchée par le diabète alors que le Nunavut fait face à une vague de suicides alarmante.




#### COMME DES SARDINES DANS LES MARITIMES

Le prisme de la densité de la population donne un tout autre aspect à la population du Canada. Plus le cercle est grand, plus la population au kilomètre carré est importante. Les provinces maritimes ne sont pas loin d'être pleines à craquer, notamment l'Île-du-Prince-Édouard, où vivent près de 25 personnes par km², un sommet au Canada. Le Nunavut et les Territoires du Nord-Ouest sont si peu peuplés, et leur territoire si vaste, qu'il faudrait plusieurs décimales pour que le chiffre sur cette carte dépasse le 0.



### AVANTAGE NUMÉRIQUE

D'où viennent les joueurs canadiens de la Ligue nationale de hockey et combien de points ont-ils amassé durant la saison 2013-2014 ? Selon cette carte, qui s'appuie sur les statistiques compilées par QuantHockey.com, la majorité vient, sans surprise, de l'Ontario. Les 59 représentants du Québec présentent la troisième meilleure moyenne de points (169), derrière celle des six joueurs de l'Île-du-Prince-Édouard (195) et des neuf joueurs de Terre-Neuve-et-Labrador.




#### **CRIME IMPARFAIT**

Après avoir fouillé dans les statistiques criminelles, *Maclean's* a mis en exergue le type de crime qui s'est présente deux fois plus souvent dans chaque province qu'à l'échelle du pays, en 2012. À en croire ces résultats, il faut craindre la prise d'otages au Nouveau-Brunswick, le harcèlement par téléphone à l'Île-du-Prince-Édouard, l'intimidation d'une personne associée au système judiciaire ou d'un journaliste au Québec, ou encore les courses de rue en Alberta.



#### **OBÉSITÉ: ATTENTION DANGER**

En matière d'obésité, certains Canadiens se comparent plus que d'autres à nos voisins immédiats. Près de 28 % de la population terreneuvienne présente un indice de masse corporelle supérieur à 30, soit le plus haut total au Canada. Les Québécois font bonne figure dans ce classement où les Britanno-Colombiens apparaissent comme étant les Canadiens les plus en santé.



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

Social media research firm Full Duplex analyzed geolocated Tweets to see where people tweet about hockey



For the next map, to find out where Canadians cursed the most, we also asked Full Duplex for assistance. The company analyzed a year of tweets to find in which cities the F-word appeared most frequently. Given its massive population, Toronto, of course, came out on top. But even after factoring in different population sizes, T.O. Twitter users still swore the most. Using Toronto as the base, here's how the frequency of F-words breaks down across some of Canada's biggest cities.



It's always a surprise when people first learn that the very tip of southwestern Ontario is at a lower latitude than parts of California—which got us wondering: How do other parts of the country line up with the rest of the world? Here are the results, using Earthtools.org. Most of the cities on this map, and their global counterparts, lie within less than 50 km of each other, latitudinally speaking, of course. Only Quebec-Ulan Bator and Fort McMurray-Moscow are a full degree apart.



What to say? Canada is a land of contrasts. It also offers up a bounty of clichés.




According to a report last year commissioned by Motion Picture Association-Canada, in 2011, the film industry generated \$20.4 billion in GDP for the Canadian economy and employed 263,000 people. So yeah, it's big. Drawing on a list of movies filmed in Canada, and inspired by this, we pulled together a breakdown of genres filmed in Canada's movie hubs.

# **HOLLYWOOD NORTH BY GENRE**


Americans love making movies in Canada. Here's a breakdown, by city and type of movie, of many of the biggest films to be shot here. While not an exhaustive list, it shows Vancouver punches above its weight in action flicks.



Ok, let's be serious for a second. The recovery since the Great Recession of 2008 has not been even, as shown by this map, which captures the last five years of employment growth. There's still a lot of red in Ontario, representing cities where there are fewer jobs now than there were in 2009.



When Canadians aren't talking about hockey (or church), they have weather on their minds. These are the reigning best and worst record titles for each province.



As John Maynard Keynes wrote, "In the long run, we are all dead." And the No. 1 cause of death in Canada is cancer. Number 2 is heart disease. But after those two causes, each province and territory is slightly different, when it comes to ranking their remaining leading causes of death. We've highlighted the one that most disproportionately affects each province, compared to Canada as a whole.




Clearly, baby-name maps have become <u>something</u> of a <u>thing</u>. Here's ours.



Back to hockey. QuantHockey.com boasts a thorough database of NHL players, where they're born and their performance. We sifted through the numbers to show which provinces generated the most players last season, and took it a step further to show the average points of players in each province.


# **NHL PLAYERS BY PROVINCE**



Delving into the detailed crime statistics for each of the provinces reveals some odd disparities. Below, we picked one type of crime for each province that was at least double the national average. As always, there are caveats: Some high numbers could be an anomaly for 2012, the most recent year for which comparable data is available, perhaps because of a police crackdown; other categories are small, so a coincidental event—or two or three—can skew the numbers. Regardless, they offer a peek at how certain crimes are disproportionately worse, depending on the province.



Canadians are fast catching up to our American neighbours, when it comes to our ever-expanding waistlines, but some areas are bulging faster than others.




We know Jimmy Kimmel has a thing for Rob Ford. But is everyone so obsessed with Toronto's buffoonish, cracksmoking, scandal-plagued mayor? It all depends on where they live. Once again drawing on geotagged tweet data compiled by Full Duplex, here are those cities—outside of Toronto—where people can't seem to get enough of Ford (we're looking at you, Ottawa and Vancouver) and the ones where people apparently have something better to dwell on.

## THE OTHER FORD NATION

Geolocated tweets about Toronto's disgraced Mayor Rob Ford reveal some of the cities, after Toronto, that are the most—and least—obsessed with His Worship (Ford heads scaled for frequency of tweets, from Ottawa down.)


Here's a different way to look at Canada's population. The circles represent the relative population density of each province. And yes, we know people do live in the Northwest Territories and Nunavut, but there are so few of them, and their geographies so vast, that you'd have to go a couple of decimal places before they'd register.




There's a lot of focus at the moment on incomes and inequality. We wanted to see where Canada's wealthiest households live, so we asked Environics Analytics to drawn on its CensusPlus database for the answer. This map shows those census regions where at least 30 per cent of households took home \$150,000 in 2011.




The flip-side of the wealthiest households map, of course, are those on the other end of the spectrum. This map shows those places where at least half of all households earned less than \$40,000 in 2011. You'll notice there's considerably more coloured areas on this map than the one above.




Ever felt like there are more women than men where you live, or vice versa? You may be right. Canada's distribution of males to females is anything but even.



In 2011 there were  $\frac{\text{close to } 6,000 \text{ centenarians}}{\text{close to } 6,000 \text{ centenarians}}$  living in Canada. Here they all are.



While we're on the topic of age, here are those parts of the country that skew oldest (red) and youngest (green.) Another name for this map could have been Canada's young north.




